



Soy sourcing data

On May 7, 2015 ADM announced its commitment to No Deforestation and No Exploitation, and to building a traceable and transparent SOY supply chain that protects forests worldwide.

Since then, we have been working to:

- Determine the methodology for identifying regions of high risk for deforestation, as well as traceability scores for soy.

- Based on a supplier review, create an action plan for engagement with them to achieve our commitment.
- Monitor direct suppliers via GIS to review policy implementation.
- Produce public progress reports to allow for transparency.
- Establish an issues and resolutions procedure for concerned parties to submit questions, complaints or comments.

As part of the Soft Commodities Forum (SCF), our commitments now include:

- Reach a minimum of 95% traceability to farm for our direct suppliers in the 25 priority municipalities by December 2020.
- Engage with suppliers in priority municipalities where we have business to involve them in the SCF initiatives.

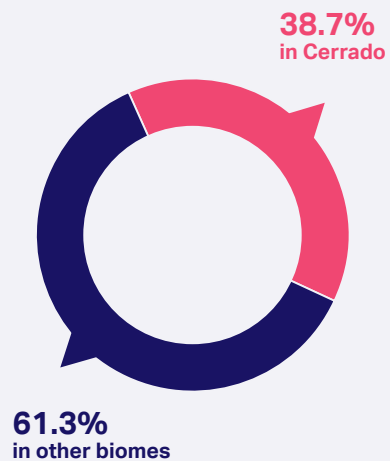

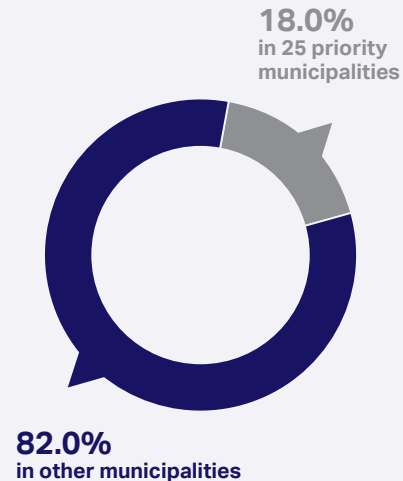

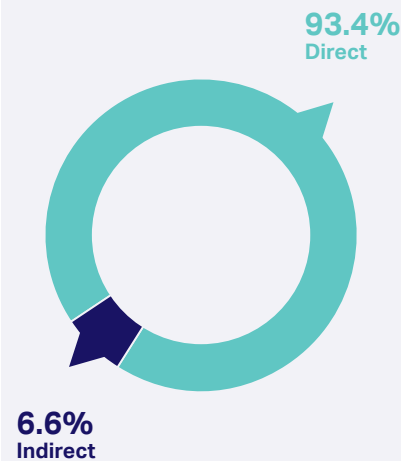
Soy volume sourced in Brazil
